

Our Areas of Activity at a Glance:



Maintenance and Management:

Emschergenossenschaft and Regionalverband Ruhr commonly support a research project for the regional park maintenance of the Emscher Landscapepark. Our long-term goal is the joint maintenance of open spaces in the New Emscher Valley.



Investment Projects:

The Working Committee shall coordinate all planned and current building measures with a common intersection (e. g. in terms of site development and design). This includes all measures of ecological/ environmental improvement of waters as well as bridging for the implementation of North-South and East-West cycle tracks.



Funding:

On the basis of the two masterplans, "Neues Emschertal" has obtained first priority in the operational "Objective 2-Programme 2007-2013" of North Rhine-Westphalia in the area of „Sustainable Urban and Regional Development“. The Working Committee coordinates (and evaluates) all project recommendations for the development of the Emscher

Landscapepark with the regional authorities. Furthermore the working committee closely cooperates with the responsible governmental authorities of North Rhine-Westphalia of the EFRE-Program.

What is the Working Committee "Neues Emschertal"?

The Working Committee „Neues Emschertal“ (valley of the river Emscher) is a cooperation between EmscherGenossenschaft (EG) and Regionalverband Ruhr (RVR).

The Committee was established by the partners in March 2006 with the target to create new perspectives for a sustainable development of the New Emscher Valley.

Basis for the cooperation are the two masterplans Emscher-Zukunft (= future of the Emscher Valley) and Emscher Landschaftspark 2010 (Emscher Landscapepark 2010), thus uniting more than 200 common regional projects for the development of the New Emscher Valley. By putting into operation the two masterplans all development potentials in terms of urban development, water supply and nature reserves are suitably linked together having the same target: to make emerge a new green center for the Metropolis Ruhr. Our common platform is the Working Committee "Neues Emschertal".

Our Areas of Activity at a Glance:



Urban and Regional Development:

One part of this field of work is the development of a spatial conception in order to create an attractive and liveable place on Emscher Island. For almost nobody knows: Between Emscher and Rhein-Herne-Kanal Emscher Island stretches over a length of 34 km and a width of 2 km between Castrop-Rauxel and Oberhausen. Target of the Working Committee is to make of Emscher Island one of the main projects in the framework of the European Capital of Culture 2010.

Landscaping and Developing the New Emscher Valley:

One of our projects is the connection of existing regional hiking trails and cycle tracks in order to create an attractive loop road across the region. In addition a concept for a way through the Emscher Valley and Emscher Island shall be designed.

Real Estate Management:

A more and more important subject in the course of the transformation of the Emscher Valley is the coordination of negotiating strategies for land acquisition especially in the case of congruent or overlapping expanses. Similar importance is attached to the mutual provision of expanses for landscape design in the New Emscher Valley.

The New Emscher Valley: The vision of attractive residential areas, living and working in the New Emscher Valley comes into existence.
